**Rev. Dr. Roderick Belin, President / Publisher
AMEC Publishing House Nashville, Tennessee**



An anointed preacher and teacher with a prophetic voice and a global mission to empower God's people to reach their full potential and fulfill their divine purposes. His ministry is characterized by love, mutuality, and respect for all people, and advocacy for justice and liberation by "restoring the poor, reclaiming the lost, realizing the vision, releasing the captive and revealing God's favor".

Dr. Belin has changed many lives by igniting these five "flames of renewal" through his innovative teaching, vibrant preaching, and outreach efforts. In over 30 years of Christian ministry, Rev. Belin has traveled across the United States, and to Jamaica, West Indies, Trinidad, the Dominican Republic, Haiti, Bermuda, Israel, England, Nigeria, Turkey, and several countries in the Republic of South Africa where he preached, counseled, facilitated workshops, and ministered in song. He is highly respected within national and international circles, leading people of different faiths into needful dialogue and healing.

A graduate of Morehouse College in Atlanta, Georgia, Dr. Belin earned the Master of Divinity Degree with concentration in New Testament and Christian Origins from the Union Theological Seminary in the City of New York as a "Union Scholar." In 2014, Rev. Belin was one of the inductees into the highly revered *Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Board of Preachers* at Morehouse College.

A third-generation minister in the African Methodist Episcopal (AME) Church, Rev. Belin has served as Executive Minister/ Assistant Pastor of the Greater Allen AME Cathedral, Jamaica, NY under the leadership of the Rev. Dr. Floyd H. Flake. He served as the pastor of Williams Chapel AME Church in Orangeburg, South Carolina before returning to his native Nashville, Tennessee in 2004 to plant Kairos Community AME Church. Dr. Belin served as Presiding Elder of the South Nashville District before being appointed as Pastor of historic Lee Chapel AME Church in North Nashville. Within two years of this appointment, he led the planning and construction of a 15,550 square foot building with sanctuary seating for 500-plus persons. This new building was dedicated in August 2015.

Dr. Belin's commitment to sharing the love of Christ extends to his service in the community. He is very involved in a burgeoning interfaith organization in the Nashville community which promotes peace and cooperation among people of different faiths including those who lay claim to no faith. He has deep love and compassion for people and an important component of his ministry is his interest in the social and academic lives of youth, and the support of persons struggling with mental health and other stigmatized issues. Rev. Belin is particularly drawn to presenting long-term remedial means to those who are underserved and marginalized. His Christian faith and ministry are governed by humility, discipline, and a fervent prayer life.

A gourmand, Dr. Belin is passionate about the imperative of true Christian hospitality and acts upon this through gatherings at his table for good food and transformative conversation. He encourages his guests to open their hearts to the other. Rev. Belin continues to bring new ideas and approaches to make positive differences in the lives of others. He is a noted techie who is committed to using technology and social media to spread the Gospel and share information through this expanded means of interaction. Dr. Belin believes, “telling the story gives faith a way to travel from one heart to another.”

He is a member of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Incorporated and is a part of a family of Christian ministers. He is the son of Bishop Henry A. Belin, Jr. and Mrs. Lucinda Crawford Belin, and brother of the Reverend Henry Allen Belin, III and the Reverend Toni Belin Ingram.

Pastor Michael K. Bouie has a tremendous passion for God’s Word coupled with a love for God’s people. He has a contagious spirit of generosity that flows through every facet of his ministry. He is a pastor with scholarly interests, known as a church administrator, with a liberationist understanding of the gospel.

Reverend Dr. Michael K. Bouie has been the senior pastor of St. James AME Church in Titusville since October 2025. He was formally welcomed to the church on Sunday, October 12, 2025. His leadership has already been marked by strong preaching, teaching, and community outreach. Before his appointment to St. James AME Titusville, Rev. Bouie served as the new pastor of Victory AME Church of Tampa, Florida, starting in July 2024.

On March 17, 2012, Pastor Bouie received the Pastoral Appointment to Mount Hermon African Methodist Episcopal Church in Miami Gardens, Florida. He becomes the 10th pastor in the history of the church. Pastor Bouie’s dedication and commitment to teaching, family, and community provide a holistic ministry perspective on the work of the local church. This has set the tone for a ministry that evangelizes the unchurched, advocates social justice, embraces the arts in worship, and lifts up the name of Jesus in bold and creative ways.

His vision is uncompromisingly clear, with one central principle; to build and develop a kingdom of empowered people for God. Pastor Bouie embraced the mantra “Forward In Faith” based in part on Ephesians 3:20 as the foundation of his ministry – “Now unto him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh

in us. With over 25 active ministries, Pastor Bouie along with the members Mount Hermon made a difference in the lives of its parishioners and the community.

Pastor Bouie has extensive pastoral experience, having served congregations in the Sixth Episcopal District (state of Georgia) — namely, Dent Chapel, Newnan; Wesley Chapel, Rockmart, and Greater Bethel in Athens. Pastor Bouie has also served congregations in the Eleventh Episcopal District (state of Florida); namely, Hurst Chapel, Winter Haven; Allen Chapel, Daytona Beach; Mount Olive, Orlando; St. Paul, Miami, Mt. Hermon, Ft. Lauderdale and Allen Temple in Tampa.

While serving as the Pastor of Allen Chapel in Daytona Beach, Pastor Bouie led the congregation in completing construction of the new edifice and relocating the church from ‘historic’ Second Avenue to its present location. Additionally, he led the congregation in the construction and completion of an education and administrative wing.

Pastor Bouie received the Doctor of Ministry degree from Payne Theological Seminary in Wilberforce, OH in 2021; the Master of Divinity degree from the Interdenominational Theological Center (I.T.C.) – Turner Theological Seminary in Atlanta, Georgia and the Bachelor of Science degree in Business Management from Morris Brown College in Atlanta. He currently serves on the AME Church General Board, former president of the AME Church’s Connectional Council and is a proud brother of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc.

Pastor Bouie is married to Rev. Tamira Vanica Bouie. God has blessed him with four daughters: Paula Michelle, Carla Lorraine, Michaela Monique and Micah Vashti Maria; five grandchildren: Aniya Lorraine, Jayden Darnell Keith, Khalil Jamal, Brylen and Derrick Edward, III. As a dynamic ministry team, Pastor and Rev. Tamira are dedicated servants of God, continuing the work of making Mount Hermon in Miami Gardens – “A Place of Refreshing!”
